Dear Trinity Family,

It's hard to believe that it is March already! With all this winter weather, it feels as though Christmas never ended, and yet here we are at Lent. Don't blink, or you might miss Easter!

This Lent, we are submerging ourselves in the Good News. This is not typically where we focus during this season; much like how we focused on fear during Advent, we are doing things a little differently this Lent. As Penny told the children when she "hid the Alleluias," Lent is typically a quiet time. It is a season to reflect on the past year, the places where we've made mistakes, and the ways we can make amends. We try to deepen our connection to God, often through fasting—abstaining from something to turn our attention back to God in our moments of want.

All of these practices are important and can still be honored in this season. However, our insistence on the Good News during this time also pulls us closer to God. It is a reminder that the practices we take on are not done for God's sake, but for our own. God's love for us is never-ending. Yes, God wants us to turn back, to repent for our wrongdoing, and to make things right. God wants us to be accountable to one another and to be in right relationship. But God wants those things because they are good for **us**—not because God is some grand ruler seeking total control and submission. God loves us in our sin, in our wandering, and in our mistakes. This is the Good News into which we are leaning this Lent.

This grace is so visible in both Jesus' actions and his parables. The Gospels tell story after story of people who have wandered from God, who have made mistakes, or who have chosen selfishness over their neighbor. And each time, they are invited back into the fold without question: the woman caught in adultery and those who demanded Jesus act in judgment (John 8:1–11); the parables of the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the lost son (Luke 15); Zacchaeus being invited to host dinner (Luke 19:1–10); and Jesus washing the feet of Judas (John 13).

So this Lent, continue to take accountability, turn back to God, and practice repentance and fasting. But be assured: there is nothing you have done that could make God love you any less, and there is nothing you can do that will make God love you any more. Wherever you are this Lenten season, remember this Good News: you are always invited, you are always loved, and you are always a child of God.

*"Like a mother who will not forsake her nursing child, like a father who runs to welcome the prodigal home, God is faithful still."* (A Brief Statement of Faith)


## Covenant Group

### *Winter Bazaar News*
