Dear Trinity,

The Lord answered, “Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things. One thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the better part. It won’t be taken away from her.” (Luke 10:41-42)

Jesus loves to eat. Perhaps it is because eating is a necessary bodily function, or perhaps he simply loved the company. Regardless of his reasons, Jesus is most often portrayed around a table, inviting himself over, or feeding crowds of thousands. Even his parables center on feasts or food; roughly 43% of the Gospels tell stories of Jesus with food.

In one story, Jesus invites himself over to dinner. He sees Zacchaeus—that short, sinful tax collector—up in a tree and decides that is who will host his meal. Zacchaeus was already feeling a tug at his heart, a curiosity that led a grown man to climb a tree in the middle of the day just to see this Jesus guy. But when he comes down, and when Jesus names him and calls him, it is the straw that breaks greedy camel’s back. He immediately pledges to give back four times what he has stolen and to give half of what remains to the poor. This invitation was life-changing, not only for Zacchaeus but for every neighbor he had previously harmed.

In another story, Jesus is at the home of his friends, Mary and Martha. Martha is fulfilling her role as host by preparing the meal. Mary is not fulfilling her role, choosing instead to sit at Jesus’s feet as a disciple would. Martha is rightfully frustrated. Here is a great guest, an important person, and there is so much to do to take care of him in the right ways—if her sister would just help, it would take half the time. But when she makes her complaint known, she isn’t affirmed by Jesus. Instead, he offers her an invitation as well: to put down her worries and her stress, and to focus on the importance of their time together rather than the grand feast she has in the works.

For Jesus, the meal and the food were important, but the real gift was the time around the table. That time could be spent with a feast served by Pharisees or with two fish and five loaves. Jesus spent time at tables because that is where people slowed down, talked, and shared life with one another. Jesus spent time at tables not so people could impress him with clean homes, elaborate meals, or well-decorated spaces, but so he could get to know them. To sit and eat at a table is an invitation to be present and to put aside the list of things that await after the meal.

Michael and I have been so fortunate to have had **10** meals so far with Trinity congregants. We’ve eaten in many homes around kitchen tables and in dining rooms, as well as at restaurants. We’ve been served delicious casseroles, traditional Sunday dinners, takeout pizza, and more. We’ve played games, had tea parties, learned histories, and listened to countless stories. Each meal is an invitation to take time, to break bread, and to practice the kind of presence that was essential in Christ’s ministry. In every meal, we have the opportunity to pause with a family, share in the basic necessity of eating, and engage in the sacred work of community. Of course, Jesus’s most famous meal is one we continue to practice and partake in regularly. The sacrament of communion is the foretaste of the Kingdom of Heaven. It is the realized vision of every table where Jesus sat—where he ate with Pharisees and tax collectors, leaders and servants, saints and sinners. At Christ’s table, everyone was invited and welcomed. Everyone was served and fed. It isn’t an elaborate meal; it isn’t served on fancy china or painstakingly prepared for hours. It’s a loaf of bread and a cup of wine—broken and poured, simple and staple. We often see the table as a place of high honor, but really, it is Jesus’s kitchen table. It is a place where the disciples sit comfortably reclined, where fights over greatness and humility take place, and where truth, love, and food are shared. It is the table where there is always room for one more, no matter when or how they show up.

In college, my campus ministry had a favorite prayer before our weekly meal: “Food, God’s love made edible. Amen.” May our tables be filled with and surrounded by God’s love.
