

As an Interim Minister who loves the church and knows its critical value to individuals, communities, and the world, I keep up with research in the field of church growth and healthy congregations. In a recent article by Carey Nieuwhof, quoting a Barna Group report entitled "5 Disruptive Church Trends That Will Rule 2025, one of the 5 "trends" caught my attention. It is the trend identified in the screen shot below:



Flourishing pastors with a sense of well being. You enjoyed 30 plus years of ministry with Brad and Barb, watching their children grow up, acknowledging milestones of birthdays and anniversaries, and celebrating accomplishments in their personal and professional lives. You were a vital part of their flourishing for three decades. You can and should be a vital part of your next pastor's flourishing. On the chart, note the divide at the age of 45 - it is significant and concerning that younger clergy feel more isolated than older clergy. Why is that? Societal shifts, time demands, financial demands, politics, technology - these and more figure in. Start imagining now how you individually and as a congregation will intentionally share faith, and show support, friendship, concern, and care for the pastor whom God will send so that they, too, will flourish in their time with Trinity.

The PNC and Session will have ideas on welcoming your next pastor; I am asking you to think and look beyond the initial excitement of the pastor's arrival, and imagine how to support and love this clergy person in the second year, third, fifth year, and beyond.

You can begin today by adding this individual and their family, yet unknown, in your prayers, surrounding them in a cloud of Presbyterian care that is Trinity. The report states, "as the leaders go, so goes the church." As Trinity's pastoral leadership flourishes, so, too, will your church.




