#### Trinitarians!

The General Assembly Mission Council produced an instrument for guided conversations between congregations, elders/deacons and clergy entitled "Starting New Initiatives." It is a long process covering many weeks because the practice of discerning God's leading requires time for reflection and wisdom. The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) is making use of time and energy to thoughtfully and prayerfully discern the person(s) to become your next installed minister by your vote of acceptance and support. One of the prayers, slightly modified, used in the process is from the Ignatian tradition of the Roman Catholic Church:

#### Ignatius' Awareness Examen

Provident God, thank you for all the ways you have blessed us this day. You know us better than we know ourselves. Please help us to become more aware of how you have been working in us and around us during the past months. We wish to respond to your call with love and faithfulness. We can do this only to the degree we recognize your guidance. Help us then to become more sensitive to your Spirit's direction.

If you haven't been in prayer for the PNC and their work, it is time to begin! Let's enter into a time of prayerful, and excited, anticipation of the pastor to lead the congregation for years to come!

The final prayer of the Starting New Initiatives is a prayer for looking forward, under the guidance of God's grace, led by the Holy Spirit, to serve the Lord Jesus:

Faithful God, with hope we look to the future. You accept us the way we are but also call us to grow. You give us time and opportunity and grace. We place the time between now and the next pastor in your hands. We ask you to help us be more sensitive to the Spirit's presence and guidance in all our tomorrows. We ask your special help in the areas where you are asking us to go. God, with the Spirit within our hearts, we go forward with joy and trust. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

June 21 is the next Adopt-a-Highway clean up. The group meets at Trinity at 8am.



Trinity raised over \$4000 for this campaign, allowing the Mam Christian Women for Development to address food insecurity by purchasing chickens for qualified indigenous women. These funds were in addition to Trinity's Mission Service Team's annual contribution to the partnership.

As members of the Guatemala Partnership Steering Committee, we are very grateful to Trinity's Mission Team and their commitment to reforestation in the highlands of Guatemala. The partnership between NCP, CEDEPCA (Protestant Center for Pastoral Studies in Central America), and the Mam Christian Women For Development is a beautiful enterprise that serves as a witness to the love of Christ in the world. Next January we will again go to Guatemala to be a part of the relationship building that is so critical for supporting this ministry. We would like some other Trinity folks to accompany us and see first-hand the good work that is being done there. If you might be interested in going with us and other members of the Presbytery, please feel free to speak with us.

We are also grateful for the response of donated items to our local Guatemala connection, The Thread Shed, which serves local Guatemalan high school kids with basic necessities for personal health and school. TRINITY ROCKS!
