And I pray that together we can create justice, joy, compassion, and peace in our beautiful and broken world. Jesus says, "You are the salt of the earth. You are the light of the world. Let your light shine before others."



Journey, tells the story of a monarch butterfly from egg to flight, from Addy's point of view. There is a signed copy of the book in the Library so be sure to "check it out!"




Covenant Group


Appalachía Service Project
